Holy Cross Summer Fun 2020 GAME: Pope Francis Says

Materials Needed:

- Children
- Some brainstormed creative faith actions
- Extra: a pope miter (or hat) made from cardboard or paper

Procedure:

This game is "Simon Says" with a faith-themed twist.

- 1. Explain to the children that the purpose of this game is to listen carefully to what "Pope Francis" says.
 - a. If the child chosen to be Pope Francis says the words, "Pope Francis says..." before the command of an action, then the children should follow the directions.
 - b. If the child chosen to be Pope Francis does not say the words, "Pope Francis says..." and instead simply gives a command for an action, then the children should not follow the directions.
 - c. Example:
 - i. "Pope Francis says touch your nose." (Kids should touch their nose.)
 - ii. "Hop up and down." (Kids should NOT hop.)
- 2. Choose one child to be Pope Francis. (If you have a dress up miter, please put this on the head of the "pope.")
- 3. The "pope" goes through a series of directions to the rest of the group, seeing if the group can listen carefully following the directions above.
- 4. After a few rounds, allow a new child to be the pope. Try to make sure that each child has the opportunity to be the pope.
- 5. After everyone has gotten the chance to be the pope, talk about this game.
 - a. What was it like being the pope?
 - b. What was it like to follow the pope?
 - c. Who is our pope in real life?
 - d. How does this game connect to real life? Are we supposed to listen to our pope?
