The Church Teaches...



As we journey through life, we face many and varied challenges: poor health; family hurts; criticism; being misunderstood or not appreciated; deaths; and disappointments.

Sometimes, it is supremely hard to see the “bigger picture” of what is happening as our lives unfold.

Often, we want to get busy and “fix” things or, better, have God “fix” things (and the quicker the better).

We are called, however, to walk in faith, one step at a time, trusting that God’s grace accompanies us always.

An invitation during these wetter and darker days of autumn is to remember that God’s presence is deep within us; His Spirit enables us to walk through challenging times and experiences with confidence and humble gratitude.

Jesus willingly carries us and sustains us. May He awaken us to know that we are not alone, that we are unconditionally “befriended” by Him, and He never leaves us. Everything is grace! Thanks be to God.

As we draw near to the end of the Church-year and St. Matthew’s Gospel is quickly moving toward the Passion of Christ (and the time when Christ hands over to us His work and His mission) we would be wise to carefully look at how we have managed the gifts entrusted to us. The Church, through which our generous, loving, and gracious God is still revealed, is ours to build up. Fear does not become us! Bold action, courageous witness to faith, and a desire to share the light of Christ and a place at His table is what is expected of us.

We are disciples of Jesus: His mission and His work have been entrusted to us. Laziness is not compatible with discipleship! Excuses for doing nothing will never be accepted. It will be better to have done the wrong thing than to have done nothing. The Master will return to measure what we have done and how well we have been faithful to His mission. We do not know *when* because He has given us no timetable, but He has given us many possibilities.

Homework for this week: As Jesus reached out to those on the margins of society, to those whom others avoided, and to those who had lost hope, we are asked to put our faith into practice – making sure that no one is left out or left alone. Let’s get to work!

November: The Month of All Souls—
In the fourth chapter of his Rule, St. Benedict wrote: "Day by day remind yourself that you are going to die."

While St. Benedict is not advocating an obsession with death, he is indicating the best way to embrace life: we can only turn our gaze to the one thing that matters by owning our mortality.

The pandemic has brought the reality of human frailty and mortality to our attention, hasn't it? While confronting our human frailty in a new way, it is important to keep in mind that we are mortal creatures who have been created for immortality. Psalm 90 says, "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain wisdom of heart" (v. 12). Do you wonder how different our lives would be if we kept death daily before our eyes?

Faith tells us that Christ has conquered death. Granted, each of us will die someday, but none of us is not subject to death's power because, in Christ, God has conquered death.

Our prayerful observance this month allows us to be grateful for the life we have been given, for the people who have shared our lives and who have loved and supported us throughout our lives. Saint Ambrose wrote: "We loved them in life, let us not forget them in death."

LA IGLESIA NOS ENSEÑA



A pesar de su aparente inocencia, la parábola de los talentos (Mateo 25, 14-30) encierra una carga explosiva. Sorprendentemente, el “tercer siervo” es condenado sin haber cometido ninguna acción mala. Su único error consiste en “no hacer nada” – no arriesga su talento (su don), no lo hace fructificar, lo conserva intacto en un lugar seguro.

El mensaje de Jesús es claro, ¿verdad? No al conservadurismo, sí a la creatividad. No a una vida estéril, sí a la respuesta activa a Dios. No a la obsesión por la seguridad, sí al esfuerzo arriesgado por transformar el mundo. No a la fe enterrada bajo el conformismo, sí al trabajo comprometido en abrir caminos al reino de Dios.

Lo más grave puede ser que lo mismo que le sucedió al tercer siervo de la parábola, también nosotros creamos que estamos respondiendo fielmente a Dios con nuestra actitud conservadora, cuando estamos defraudando sus expectativas.

El principal quehacer de la Iglesia hoy no puede ser conservar el pasado solamente para conservarlo, sino aprender a comunicar la Buena Noticia de Jesús en una sociedad sacudida por cambios sin precedentes. Nuestra tarea: arriesguémonos con el Señor, que está entre nosotros siempre.


